AMENDS COMMISSION CODE BOOK 140.00

Waters Closed to Commercial Fishing: No Commercial fishing is permitted in the following counties or parts of counties: Baxter; Benton; Boone; Carroll; Clark, west of Highway 67 from Arkadelphia south to county line and west of Highway 7 from Arkadelphia north to county line; Cleburne; Conway, north of Interstate 40, except Cadron Creek and the part of the North Cadron Creek in Conway county, and Point Remove Creek up the east fork to Highway 95 and the Kissire Bridge on the west fork; Crawford, north of Interstate 40; Faulkner, north of Interstate 40 and Highway 64 except that part of the North Cadron Creek in Faulkner County below Highway 285, and the Cadron Creek in Faulkner County; Franklin, north of the Missouri Pacific Railroad and east of Highway 23, and that part north of Interstate 40 and west of Highway 23; Fulton, west of Highway 63; Garland, west of Highway 7; Hempstead, north of Highway 24; Hot Spring, west of Highway 7; Howard, north of Highway 24; Independence, west of Highway 167; Izard; Johnson, north of the Southern Route of the Missouri Pacific Railroad EXCEPT Dardanelle Lake; Logan, south of Highway 10; Madison; Marion; Montgomery; Nevada, north of Highway 24 and west of Highway 67; Newton; Perry, west of Highway 7; Pike; Polk; Pope, north of Interstate 40 and east of Highway 7, and north of the Missouri Pacific Railroad and west of Highway 7 except Dardanelle Lake; Scott; Searcy; Sebastian, south of Highway 10; Sevier, north of Highway 24; Sharp, west of Highway 167 and Highway 62; Stone; Van Buren; Washington; White, north of Highway 64 and west of Highway 167; Yell, west of Highway 7 and south of Highway 10.

In addition no commercial fishing is permitted in any of the following waters: All waters upstream from 100 yards below Rempel Dam on the Ouachita River (This includes Lakes Catherine and Hamilton); Lake Erling including all tributaries upstream from 100 yards below the Lake Erling Dam to Arkansas State Highway 82; all lakes owned and/or operated by the State Parks, Recreation and Travel Commission, The U. S. Forest Service, The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission (excluding Grand Lake and all of Lake Chicot); Lake Kate Adams, Big Jefferson and Minne Anderson; and Lake Wallace in Drew and Chicot Counties; Lake Maumelle in Pulaski County, and all lakes in the Hot Springs Village area of Garland and Saline Counties. The preceding named waters shall remain closed to all commercial fishing until changed by order of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission. IF ANY of these waters are temporarily opened to commercial fishing they shall return to a closed condition at the end of the specified open period.

PENALTY: \$50.00 to \$500.00.

O R D E R

AMENDS CODE BOOK SECTION 71.05 (ITEM #1)
AND COMMISSION ORDER NUMBER 016-73

The use of any motor in excess of 10 horsepower is prohibited. (EXCEPTIONS: Party Barges may use up to and including 25 horsepower and authorized commercial boat docks will be required to have an emergency boat with sufficient horsepower to answer any emergency that might arise, regardless of lake conditions.) The 10 horsepower restriction shall not apply to Upper Lake Chicot, Grand Lake, Calion Lake, the zoned portion of Lakes Enterprise and Hinkle and all natural or channel scar lakes on Commission-owned wildlife management areas, except where signs are posted prohibiting larger motors.

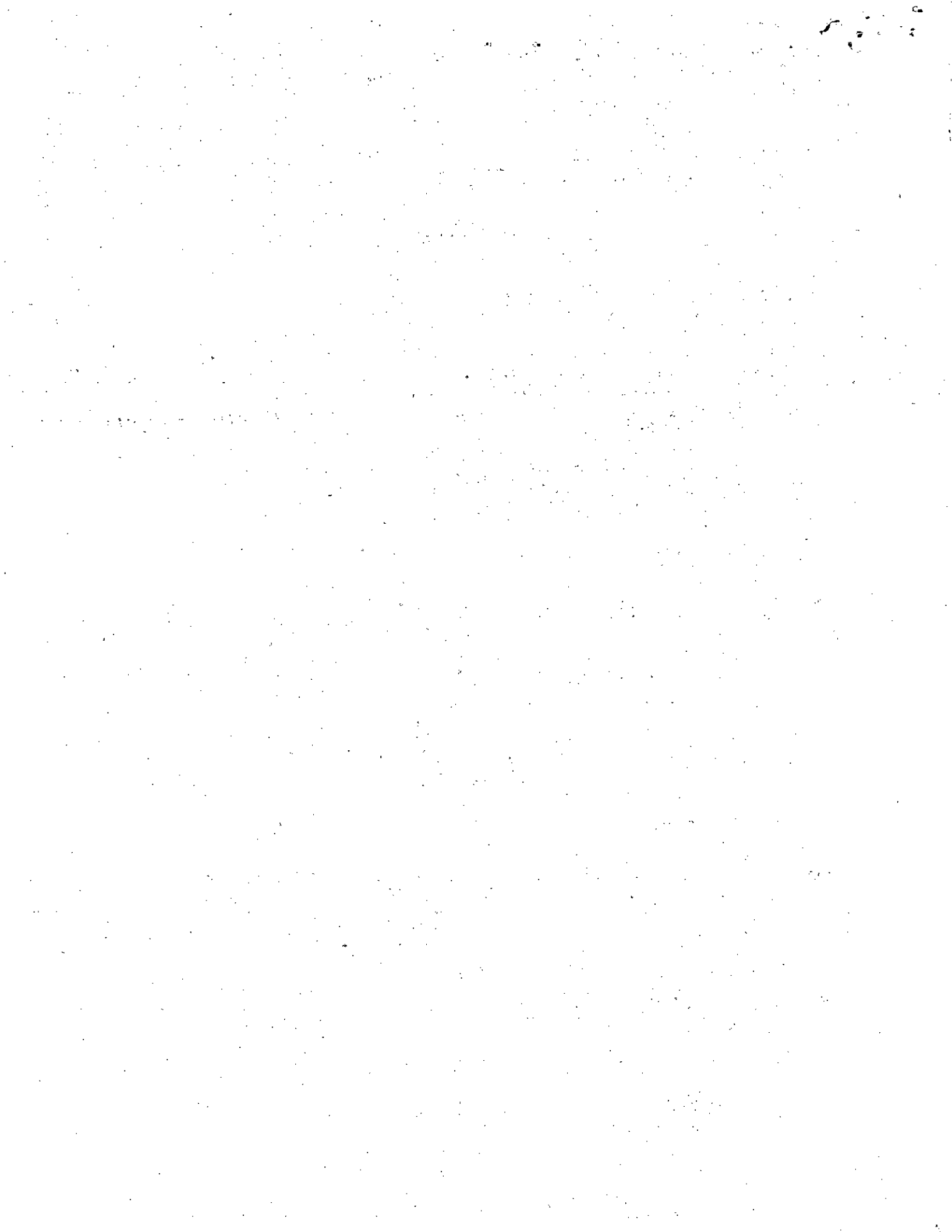

Daily Limit — 5. Possession Limit 5.
Aggregate Limit may not include more than 2 White Fronted Geese.

COOT

Same as Duck.
Daily Limit — 15. Possession Limit — 30.

GALLINULES

November 7, 1976 through January 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 15. Possession Limit — 30.

RAIL

November 7, 1976 through January 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 25. Possession Limit — 25.

WOODCOCK

December 1, 1976 through February 3, 1977.
Daily Limit — 5. Possession Limit — 10.

WILSON'S SNIPE

November 1, 1976 through February 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 8. Possession Limit — 16.

FUR-BEARER (Hunting)

12:00 Noon Nov. 20, 1976 thru Jan. 31, 1977.
Daily Limit — 6. Dogs allowed, See 1976-77 Game and Fish Commission Hunting Pamphlet.

FUR-BEARERS (Trapping)

12:00 Noon Nov 20, 1976 thru Jan. 31, 1977.
Red fox protected.

FOX HUNTING FOR PLEASURE

Year around without guns.

BEAVER

May be taken by trapping or hunting the year around during daylight hours only, except during fur-bearers season when they may be taken by trapping at any time. See 1976-77 Game and Fish Commission Hunting Pamphlet.

COYOTES AND BOBCATS

Hunting open during other open hunting seasons. See 1976-77 Game and Fish Commission Hunting Pamphlet.

CROW

Season — Feb., March, April, June and through July 5, 1977.

DEER (Gun)

November 8 through November 13, 1976.
November 26 and November 27, 1976.
December 13 through December 18, 1976.
Bag Limit - 2, Bucks only, Dogs allowed.

DEER (Archery)*

October 1, 1976 through January 31, 1977.
Annual Bag Limit — 2 either sex deer. No dogs allowed.

DEER (Crossbow)

Open only during other state-wide gun deer seasons. See 1976-77 Game and Fish Commission Hunting Pamphlet.

DEER REGULATION

Only two deer may be taken by an individual hunter, except those holders of special permits on Commission areas where one bonus deer may be taken.

* Archery Permit required for Archery hunting.

TURKEY (Fall-Gun)

October 1, thru October 31, 1976.
Bag Limit — 1 either sex turkey.

TURKEY (Fall-Archery)*

October 1, thru January 31, 1977.
Bag Limit — 1 either sex turkey.

TURKEY (Spring-Gun)

April 1, 1977 thru April 30, 1977.
Bag Limit — 2 turkey gobblers only.

TURKEY (Spring-Archery)*

April 1, 1977 thru April 30, 1977.
Bag Limit — 2 either sex turkeys.

Squirrel (Spring)

May 15, 1977 thru June 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 8. Possession Limit — 16. No dogs allowed.

SQUIRREL (Fall)

October 1, 1976 thru January 31, 1977.
Daily Limit — 8. Possession Limit — 16 Dogs allowed.

QUAIL

December 1, 1976 thru February 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 8. Possession Limit — 16. Dogs allowed.

RABBIT

October 1, 1976 thru February 15, 1977.
Daily Limit — 8. Possession Limit — 16. Dogs allowed.

DOVE

September 1, 1976 thru October 5, 1976.
December 15, 1976 thru January 8, 1977.
Bag Limit — 10 daily, Possession Limit — 20.
Shooting hours.. 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset. Shotguns must be plugged.

TEAL

September 18 thru September 26, 1976.
Bag Limit — 4 daily, Possession Limit — 8.
Shooting hours....Sunrise to Sunset.

DUCK

November 20, 1976 thru December 11, 1976.
December 18, 1976 thru January 14, 1977.
Limit-Point System..Daily Limit — 100 points.
Possession Limit: (Twice daily bag limit.)

Canvasback — 100 points. Mallard hen, Wood Duck, black duck, hooded mergansers and red-head — 70 points each.
Pintail, blue-winged teal, cinnamon teal, gadwall, shoveler, scaup and green-winged teal count 10 points each; drake mallard and all other species of ducks and mergansers count 25 points each.
Only the last duck killed may exceed the 100 points. Shotguns must be plugged.

Shooting hours — 1/2 hour before sunrise until sunset.
All Game and Fish areas open to 1/2 day waterfowl hunting will be open all day the last three(3) days of each season. (Rest Areas included).

CANADA GOOSE

Same as Duck.
Daily bag limit — 1. Possession Limit — 2.

Areas closed to Canada Goose hunting.

PECKERWOOD AREA — Bounded on West by State Highway 11; on the North by U.S. Numbered State Highway 70; on the East by State Highway 33; on the South by U.S. Numbered Highway 79.

TABLE ROCK AREA — All of Boone and Carroll Counties lying North of U.S. Numbered State Highway 62.


WHITE RIVER NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE AREA — Bounded on the West and North by State Highway 1 to the White River; all of the area in Phillips, Desha and Arkansas Counties lying South of State Highway 20 and West of Missouri Pacific Railroad; on the South by the Arkansas River.

BIG LAKE AREA — All of Mississippi County west of Interstate 55; and North of State Highway 158.

WAPANOCCA NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE AREA — All of Crittenden County East of Interstate 55; West of the Main West Levee of the Mississippi River; and North of Interstate 40.
